Projects and Model prepared by the students to develop creativity and thinking skill. Students participate in various activities such as seminar, group discussion, Class level projects, class level seminar and presentation, and students develop technical skills while presenting papers in seminars.Teachers use ICT-enabled Smart Classrooms with projectors, and Wi-Fi connectivity to amplify experiential learning. The government appoints a DDO to manage college finances, withdrawing funds from the treasury and distributing salaries and benefits to staff. The government allocates an annual budget for essential expenses, with provisions for additional funding. The staff council and purchase committee review expenditure plans to ensure effective resource use. Department heads oversee facility maintenance and upgrades, with budgets based on requests from committee conveners and teachers-in-charge. Student admission fees are used for college improvements, determined by the Janbhagidari committee. The university covers exam administration costs, distributed to departments by the exam superintendent and coordinator.

College provides an advantageous platform for students to develop skills, knowledge, attitude, values to shape their

behaviour in the correct way. All the departments conduct innovative programs and activities which stimulate the creative ability of students and provide them a platform to nurture their problem-solving skills and ensure participative learning. This College has focused on various methodology of teaching so that they can nourish the students in such a way that the best outcome can be availed from them. Experiential learning is the process of learning through experience by doing and reflecting. The institution imparts the various experiential learning practices to enhance creativity and cognitive levels of the students. Laboratory Sessions are conducted with content beyond syllabus experiments. Activities, games and group discussion enhance the overall learning experience. Projects and Model prepared by the students to develop creativity and thinking skill. Students participate in various activities such as seminar, group discussion, Class level projects, class level seminar and presentation, and students develop technical skills while presenting papers in seminars. Teachers use ICT-enabled Smart Classrooms with projectors, and Wi-Fi connectivity to amplify experiential learning. Google Classroom, Google Meet, YouTube, Whatsapp, Zoom have helped to incorporate the model of flipped classroom and blended learning. Departments encourage students to acquire and develop problem solving skills. For this, most of the department of college organizes guest lectures on various topics. Group discussion, class level projects and practical assignments form a regular part of the curriculum.

6.4.3 - Institutional strategies for mobilization of funds and the optimal utilization of resources

Indira Gandhi Govt. College Pandaria adheres to the Chhattisgarh State Government's policy framework for fund mobilization and resource utilization. The institution has adopted strategic measures to achieve financial stability and efficient resource management, aligning with government policies and institutional objectives. This includes optimizing resource allocation, ensuring financial sustainability, and implementing effective management practices to achieve its goals. The institution has established clear guidelines for the utilization of funds and resource allocation. Firstly, the institution generates revenue primarily through student fees, excluding tuition fees, which are charged in accordance with university and government regulations. Secondly, the institution receives a salary grant from the government, which covers the salaries of full-time teaching and non-teaching staff. To facilitate this, the institution prepares an annual budget outlining the estimated salary grant required and submits it to the government for approval. This ensures transparent and accountable management of funds, with a clear focus on resource optimization. The government appoints a DDO to manage college finances, withdrawing funds from the treasury and distributing salaries and benefits to staff. The government allocates an annual budget for essential expenses, with provisions for additional funding. The staff council and purchase committee review expenditure plans to ensure effective resource use. Department heads oversee facility maintenance and upgrades, with budgets based on requests from committee conveners and teachers-in-charge. Student admission fees are used for college improvements, determined by the Janbhagidari committee. The university covers exam administration costs, distributed to departments by the exam superintendent and coordinator.
