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# 1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

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## 1.1 INTRODUCTION

Indira Gandhi Government College, Pandaria Distt. Kabirdham (C.G.) is affiliated to Hemchand Yadav University Durg (C.G.). This college is an emerging college in Kabirdham District of Chhattisgarh and is located in the close vicinity of the Haff river near NH130 A. It was established in 1984 and enlighten the students' fraternity of Pandaria and nearby villages. The institute has been recognised under 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act 1956. The college has around 15 acres of campus, including a playground, garden and parking, which provides a vast opportunity for infrastructural development.

The college has touched new heights by making its goal meaningful. Earlier, college had a system of study in the Arts faculty till graduation. It started 38 years ago with about 100 students. The college is today imparting education to about 1549 students. The institute has 09 regular and 11 temporary teachers. Earlier, the college was being run in an additional room of the basic primary school, Pandaria, which is today operating from its own building in Village Rauha (Pandaria). In this college, from the academic session 1984 to 2008, only B.A. Classes of the Faculty of Arts continued to be conducted. In the education session 2008-09, B.Sc. and B.Com. classes were started under public participation and from the session 2010-11, M.A. in Sociology, History and Hindi literature classes were started. In the year 2018-19, M.Com was introduced to the college. The college has 06 class rooms (3 ICT enabled classes), 04 laboratories (Chemistry, Botany/Zoology, Physics and Geography). The library of the college has more than 17000 books. It has adapted ICT based methodologies in teaching, learning & evaluation and provided a Wi-Fi facility. The College IQAC has been functioning as a catalyst for quality substance and enhancement. The campus is environmentally conscious and undertakes green practices and conservation of natural resources as its priority. The institute celebrates National festivals and other important National and International Days.

The college adheres to its expansive vision and, blending it with the ever-changing contemporary dynamic job environment, it remoulds itself to cater to the needs of the students and service to society.

- Well-qualified, dedicated and competent staffs are present in the college.
- The majority of students who belong to the SC, ST and OBC categories come from surrounding villages and hence overall upliftment of society and social harmony prevails in the college.
- Our college has various types of cell which organize various activities for the overall development of students.
- Active help desk and grievance redressal mechanism.

- Improper availability of electricity in the institution.
- The institution does not have placement cell.

- The institution has not Hostel facility.

- The college has required infrastructure facilities to attract industrial collaboration.
- The willingness of society and government to promote women's education.
- To open certificate/diploma courses by govt/self finance.
- To start UPSC/PSC /Railway/Banking /SSC coaching.
- An increase in the number of students per session is creating bright opportunities to develop our college.
- Many industries and the newly formed Kabirdham district have created ample job opportunities for the students passing out from our college.
- The growing use of ICT resources enable the outreach of the various programs.
- Better use of the vast potential of the alumni.
- More effective placement cell.
- Scope to increase more Skill development and entrepreneurship program.

### **Institutional Challenge**

- Most of the students belong to backward rural areas. They don't have basic facilities to get higher education.
- Most of the students are weak in the basic English language and standard Hindi language.
- Parental pressure on students for extra work which is not relevant to their education.
- To get grants from local stakeholders for institutional development.
- Security problems in college due to an incomplete boundary wall.
- To attract eminent researchers and academicians to the campus.
- For construction & restoration of the institute, the Public Works Department (PWD) don't pay specific attention to this institution.

## **1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY**

### **Curricular Aspects**

Indira Gandhi Government College, Pandaria Distt. Kabirdham (C.G.) is affiliated to Hemchand Yadav University, Durg (C.G.). The academic calendar, time-table, and annual strategic plan are prepared by committee under the supervision of IQAC. All the teachers of the college get textbooks and other books from the library. Internet facilities are made available to all the teachers and students. The help center (admission-related) is arranged to help all students. Competitive examination guidance is provided to the students by the college teachers. The maximum number of teachers use information technology and communication (ICT) for enhancing teaching skill.

The college conducts various internal assessments continuously of all subjects through unit test, sessional exam, pre-annual exam, practical exam etc. under the guidelines of university and higher education department.

Seminars and lectures are also conducted related to competitive examinations so that the students can get help

to qualify for such examinations. The syllabus implemented in our institution was also approved by the coordination committee of the Higher Education Department Chhattisgarh. Our institute uses different teaching aids, such as chalk-dusters, green boards, projectors etc. and methods like seminars, workshops, group discussions etc. to improve a students command over the subjects.

Faculty members use learning aids and innovative ideas to improve the knowledge of students. The college runs a syllabus-based course “Environmental Studies and Human Rights” at graduation level in the first year degree course, Odesigned by the affiliated university. Our institute conducts various other activities related to gender issues and human values, like Beti-Bachao, Beti-Padhao, Save Girls Child, etc. Several students of our college get benefitted by the experiential learning practices through field trips, project work and assignments in every academic year.

The college has a feedback analysis committee that collects the feedback based on curriculum from various stakeholders like students, teachers and alumni. The feedback Analysis committee analyses the feedback given by various stakeholders and prepares an action taken plan under the supervision of IQAC and submits it to the principal of the college.

### **Teaching-learning and Evaluation**

The college is located in Pandaria block, which is OBC populated area. In this college 12th pass out aspiring to get admission in Arts, Science and Commerce stream and UG pass out student seeking admission in M.A. Hindi, M.A. Sociology, M.A. History, and M.Com. Programme. The process of admission to various programmes is transparent, fare and students are given admission on the basis of merit, which is prepared according to Government rule. The college follows the reservation policy (ST-32%, SC-12%, OBC-14% & PWD-5%) laid down by Chhattisgarh Government. Atlast if any programme seats remain vacant The institute gives open admission according to university and Govement guidelines. The college is co-educational institution and in most of the programme girls outnumber the boys. Here every possible measure is undertaken for conducive class-room environment and teaching learning made effective so that advanced learner as well as slow learner get benefitted. Teachers are encouraged by institution to use the modern teaching aids and technological tools along with conventional teaching method.

Besides this, teachers are engaged in not only giving information to student but they focused on student learning also. The academic performance of student gauged by internal evaluation on the basis of marks secured by them in unit/class test, assignment, seminar, project work etc. The college has IQAC which reviews the academic progress of every department and conduct the academic audit. Moreover in Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE) system, adopting the transparent and robust mechanism to assess the progress of students according to specified scheduled defined by Department of Higher Education Chhattisgarh. Methodology of evaluation process, examination pattern, programme and course outcome are communicated to students through the website, class interaction and college prospectus at the time of admission. The examination related grievances addressed in transparent, time-bound and efficient way through examination committee. Those students who are not satisfied with given marks they can apply for re-evaluation, retotalling and photocopies of answer sheets. The college has developed a feedback system which keeps eye on teaching- learning process and student satisfaction.

### **Research, Innovations and Extension**

Higher Education is a knowledge enterprise that creates, archives and disseminates knowledge. Knowledge creation is the function of research and other development activities in terms of academic enrichment, community welfare activities and human resource development leading to national development. This college is committed to progress in the spectrum of research, innovation and extension. The college has young faculty and striving to promote research culture. All faculties are encouraged to participate in workshops, seminars and symposia for making a research sphere in the college. College also motivates the faculty members and students to organise various seminars and workshops at Institutional/State/National/International levels. The college has created an eco-system for innovations and has initiatives for creation and transfer of knowledge.

The extension activities of the college are monitored by the enthusiastic participation of students and faculties and co-ordinators of various committee. They organise tree plantation drives, village visits, creating awareness for cleanliness, awareness for removal of old and rotten traditions and customs of the society like superstition, untouchability etc. The college is focusing on collaborative work and exploring innovative programmes. MoU is for collaboration between Indira Gandhi Govt. College Pandaria and Aatal Bihari Vajpeyi Govt. college Pandatrai, Govt. Rajmata Vijayaraje Sindhiya Girls. College Kawardha, APSGMNS Govt. PG. College Kawardha, Govt. Naveen College Kui-kukdur, which share and provide knowledge, technology and skill based training to the students of college in order to enhance the quality of educational experience of students.

Also joint seminar and invited talks were conducted. College has timely conducted various awareness programs in the form of workshops, rallies, slogan writing, Rangoli, poster making, etc. on emerging social issues on Swaksh Bharat mission, AIDS awareness programme, Women empowerment programme, Green initiative programme etc. in campus and nearby villages. The faculties and student learnt the use of different learning and social media platforms (Google Meet, Zoom, Webex). Faculty have delivered invited talk related to social prospective and application of science and technology in college and other college. Various type of one day administrative programmes were also organized by college with experts.

### **Infrastructure and Learning Resources**

The college has own building spread up 1520 sq meter built up area comprising 06 class room and Library, Principal office, teacher staff room, Girls common room, cycle stand, staff parking, Cultural Programme stage, separate washrooms for male and female. There are separate laboratories for Chemistry, Botany / Zoology, physics, Geography and limited class rooms are provided with projectors. The college campus is under 10 CCTV surveillance to ensure transparency as well as safety to all its members. The entire campus of this college is Wi-fi enabled with open access to every student and faculty member. The institute has provided above mentioned all class rooms with a sufficient number of tables and chairs, natural ventilation, green / black boards. All class rooms are cleaned regularly to maintain overall ambience. College campus is installed with adequate fire safety devices. The library of College is well-stocked with a good collection of books. The College library has valuable collection of more than 17000 books. Faculties and students use Z-library, Google scholar and Research Gate for e-resources like e-journals, e-books etc. It provides a space to study, procuring material for study and services to assist learning. The library of our college makes all efforts to acquire useful books including rare books and other knowledge resources to enrich its collection. Photo-copying facility for students and staff in the library. The reference book, textbook and books for competitive exams are indexed, categorized according to programs and subjects. All books are coded by accession number. The college has updated its IT facilities with the increasing number of computers, printers, scanners, smart boards, projectors etc. To perform these activities the college has provided 02 desktops in the teaching-learning process to the students. The College has always endeavoured to make the campus IT-oriented to keep in tune with the

demands of modern times. Moreover, college has been providing safe drinking water facility through installation of Water cooler. Our college is dedicated to provide a better infrastructure and learning resource for the welfare of students.

### **Student Support and Progression**

The college has an effective student support and progression system. The maximum number of enrolled students in the institute has been benefited by scholarship and freeship provided by the government during the last years. For the students progression, the college organises soft skill, language and communication skill, ICT skill programmes. Capacity building and skill enhancement initiatives are taken by Indira Gandhi Govt. college Pandaria. The college also organises career counselling, expert lectures for competition examinations and various types of lecture organized by departments under the supervision of the Principal. The institution has a transparent mechanism for timely redressal of student grievances including sexual harassment and ragging cases. The college has a committee for anti-ragging cell and an internal complaint committee for students, which are dedicated to implementation of guidelines of statutory/ regulatory bodies. The committee organized various awareness programs. The college provides online/offline students' grievances redressal form. Some students of the college have qualified for the state level/ national level exam, like Mandi sub-inspecture exam, Central Industrial Security Force exam, Chhattisgarh police exam etc. Many graduate students of college go to study for higher education. The graduate students are working with the state government and many students are preparing for civil examinations. The college has an active student council which is formed every year and they actively participate in various activities. The students take active participation in various sports and cultural activities. Alumni association plays an important role in the progression and development of the institution. Our college has an alumni association which is dedicated to the welfare of our institute. Annually, meetings of alumni associations are organised in our college and feedback is collected and the Feedback analysis committee prepares an action taken plan as per suggestions given by members of the alumni association under the supervision of the Principal of our college. ## 2.3 Teaching- Learning Process

### 2.3.1 Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences using ICT tools

**Response:**

Indira Gandhi Govt. college Pandaria has focused on various other methodology of teaching so that they can nourish the students in such a way that the best outcome can be availed from them. To achieve this objective, the faculties use various student-centric methodologies, such as follows:

- The teaching-learning process is augmented by presentations, discussions, debates, assignments, interactions with experts and industrial professionals, remedial classes and tutorials, workshops and college/national level seminars.
- Regular activities like group discussions, debates, quizzes, field visits, seminars, Poster Making, Poetry recitation, Essay writing etc. were organized regularly, wherein the students were encouraged to voice their views and opinions.
- Teachers use ICT-enabled Smart Classrooms with projectors, and Wi-Fi connectivity to amplify experiential learning.
- Other virtual platforms like Google Classroom, Google Meet, YouTube, Whatsapp, Zoom have helped to incorporate the model of flipped classroom and blended learning.
- Teachers demonstrate and students perform practices in the laboratory under observation. Experimental learning creates laboratory awareness, handling of instruments, glass wares and chemicals.
- Another mode of providing learning experience for students is arranging guest lectures, invited talks and student seminars by the Department Associations.
- Problem solving methodologies are intended to make the students take responsibilities, solve problems, resolve conflicts and find alternatives. It promotes critical thinking, creativity and scientific temperament.

- Soft Skills training Programmes have been organized to learn Common etiquette, interview skills and others, like lectures on Utility of PAN card, SBI YONO App, lecture on computer application etc.
- In the science stream, the mode of teaching is both theoretical and practical. Teachers demonstrate and students perform practical practices in the laboratory under observation. Experimental learning creates laboratory awareness, handling of instruments, glass wares and chemicals. The summative assessment ensures the end outcome of performance.
- In colleges, many departments have their respective societies in which the students are guided to perform certain activities in which one of the most popular techniques used by the faculties is to conduct PowerPoint presentation activities by the students, in which the students not only develop their communication and technological skills but learn by participating in the teaching process.
- Many programs operational in the college have project work and dissertation as an important part of their syllabus in which the students have to perform field work in MA sociology. The faculties help the students with performing their research work, such as designing the questionnaire, selecting the research area or the topics or any other area deemed necessary as per their expertise.
- The project work was pursued by the students with the guidance of faculty, for which they visited some specified places, labs and industrial places, carried out investigations and submitted reports on their.

It is observed that students reflect in a very positive way towards work and education when they are using computers to complete tasks given to them, encouraging and motivating them to gain knowledge and skills. Students who use ICT tools have increased self- confidence and better understanding of the subjects of interest as well as skills.

## 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

#### 2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

**Response:**

The annual and semester exam related grievances come under jurisdiction of university. Grievance redressal cell of the university examination is in accordance to the university regulations in time-bound manner. Discrepancies in the university examination marks are to be rectified by the university through the principal. To avoid grievances, the college circulates and display notice regarding registration of exam form, hall ticket, dates of exams, etc. in classrooms and notice boards respectively.

- All the faculty members also inform students in their classrooms.
- The university sends exam schedule to the college and the same is brought to the notice of the students.
- After the declaration of results the university notifies the deadline of 15 days to apply for the verification, revaluation, photo copy of answer sheet, and re-verification of the answer sheets.
- Accordingly, the students can apply with their grievances to the university.
- If the photo copy of the answer sheet is demanded, the same is provided to the students.
- If the demand is to reevaluate the answer sheet, the students get the paper reassessed.
- If there is any change in marks, the same is conveyed to the students by the university and their mark sheets are amended.
- The college takes measures to resolve grievances transparently and fairly.

- The students against whom U.F.M.(Unfair Mean) cases are registered in the final/semester examinations are dealt with justifiably.
- Materials of cheating are confiscated and their records are maintained.
- The students are given opportunity to clarify their stand.
- The university constitutes a committee to look into the matter and appropriate measures are taken judicially, transparently and within the time limit.
- There is a provision for revaluation of the answer sheets.
- Those students who are not satisfied with the marks given can apply for revaluation.
- If the students are not satisfied even with the revaluation, they can get the photocopies of their answer copies by depositing the stipulated fee and they can have their answer sheets valued on their own and find out the actual position.
- If the internal grievances related to class tests/unit tests, presentation, assignments, practical and project work etc are resolved by IQAC committee in consultation with respective faculty members.

- The Programme Specific Outcomes are closely related to the content of the syllabus and may vary as per the subject. Teachers design Lesson Plans for all the courses/subjects at the beginning of each semester to ensure that the pedagogy is in sync with the PSOs. There are some universal learning outcomes, also which are inherent in every syllabus.

- Online tests/exams are conducted through social media and e-assignments are given through google forms using cloud computing. ## 4.2 Library as a Learning Resource

#### 4.2.1 Library is automated using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS), subscription to e-resources, amount spent on purchase of books, journals and per day usage of library

**Response:**

- The library of Indira Gandhi Government College Pandaria is well-stocked with a good collection of books. It provides a space to study, procuring material for study and services to assist learning.
- Libraries are the treasure trove of knowledge. A common library is the centre of knowledge acquisition for students post their classroom studies.
- The library has a subscription of N-List (National Library and information services Infrastructure for Scholarly Contents) is under the progress.

- Faculties and students use Z-library, Google scholar and Research Gate for e-resources like e-journals, e-books, research paper etc.
- The library plays a very important role in the learning of the students as most of the students are not able to buy the required number of books recommended by the teachers due to their financial constraints. The students are allowed to take two books using their library cards.
- In colleges, the library occupies a prominent position and it is an important and integral part of the teaching programme. It is not merely a depository of books, but an active workshop instrument in the production of original thinking.
- The Library of our College makes all efforts to acquire useful books including rare books and other knowledge resources to enrich its collection. Photo-copying facility for students and staff in the library is available.
- The library of college is not automated within integrated library management system. We have small infrastructure in our college. In one room library is being run since 1984. At present, library has more than 17000 books in various subjects such as chemistry, Zoology, Botany, Mathematics, Physics, Political Science, History, Social Science, Economics, Geography, Hindi Language, English Language, Commerce in UG and PG programme.
- In the computer of library downloaded e-books are available for students. They can read and store in pen drive or other drives. All the books are issued for students and teachers. The issued related all data is being recorded in registers. The college is recording information of students in library.
- The reference book, textbook and books for competitive exams are indexed, categorized according to programmes and subjects. All books are coded by accession number.
- Along with the books of subjects, a small collection of books is available for the competitive exams ranging from UPSC Civil Services Examination, SSC, Railways, Banking to State Services, and Vyapam.
- Our college has no subscription to e-resources like e-journals, e-Shodh-Sindhu, Shodhganga Membership, e-books etc.
- The library extends opportunities for self-education to the deserving and enthusiastic students without any distinction. Libraries develop in each student a sense of responsibility in the pursuit of knowledge.
- College library stimulates the students to obtain, evaluate and recognize knowledge and to familiarize themselves with the trends of knowledge for further education and learning new disciplines.

In staff council meeting every participating member is free to express his opinion. The Principal is the head of office who takes the lead in the governance and management of the college. In the last five years, the number of students enrolled in

the college was 883, 962,1084,1458 and 1549. The council takes appropriate measures for the implementation of the strategic plan. Meetings of Janbhagidari samiti and IQAC are organised in college, which play a vital role in the overall development of the college. College administration focuses on ICT infrastructure. Three rooms of the college are enabled with ICT. In this way, the institution practices decentralization and participative management.

### Case Study:

The admission committee arranges the admission of the college. Separate sub-committees have been formed for Arts, Commerce, and Science faculty immediately after the declaration of the higher secondary board exam. Affiliated University has begun the online process for admission and enrolment. The committee receives the list of students who have applied online for admission. The committee prepares a merit list as per the rules, regulations and reservation policy of the government and conducts the admission process in a transparent mode.

**Appointment and service rule:**

The institute works under the government. The college follows rules and regulations as per the service rules 1961 and 1965 of the government. The administrative setup is sanctioned by the state government. According to the CG service rules for higher education, all assistant professors and professors are directly recruited by selection through CGPSC. Non-teaching staffs are selected through VYAPAM and promotion. The Class-III posts are filled as per the norms of the state government. The guest lecturers are selected by the appointments committee of the college as per the guidelines of the Department of Higher Education. Self-finance/JB supporting staff are also appointed in the college. Then employees take benefits from various-annual increments which have been recorded. The Administrative Staff of the college is also characterised by a well-defined organisational structure, with positions according to the Department/ University rules and the UGC. The retirement age for Principal, Professor and Assistant Professor is 65 years and other staff retirement age is 62 years.

**Strategic/Perspective/development/Perspective plan:**

Since the mission of the institution is to nurture young minds of neighbourhoods in college.

The IQAC has identified some broad aims for perspective plans. The strategic plan and deployment committee constitute the annual strategic plan under the supervision of IQAC. Appraisal for teaching staff is based on the Performance-Based Appraisal Scheme (PBAS). The PBAS proforma details individual teacher's teaching-learning and evaluation-related activities, research and academic contributions, administrative support and contribution in extra- and co-curricular activities as had been detailed in UGC- CAS guidelines. Teachers maintain the records of teaching, examinations, college work, Research, and Project to calculate their API score. Based on the above details a comprehensive evaluation is done by the Principal so that a fair idea about the performance can be ascertained after the analysis performance of respective faculty.

Similarly for non-teaching staff, a confidential report which contains details of the jobs performed by the staff during the academic year is mentioned which is certified by submitted to the principal for final remarks.

**6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization****6.4.1 Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)****Response:**

The primary source of funds for the college is government allocation of the funds as the tuition and other fees are nominally charged to the students. The college aims at the mobilization of funds through all possible alternatives available.

1. The DDO of the college is appointed by the govt., who has the right to withdraw money from the treasurer and distribute it as salary to his subordinate employees.

2. At the beginning of every financial year, the budget is allocated to the college by the government for main expenses like salary, furniture, equipment, electricity, and other necessary expenses. If, due to any unforeseen condition, any other requirement arises, demand is forwarded to the appropriate authority for allocating more funds.

3. For efficient, timely, and optimum utilization of available resources, the staff council committee and purchase committee discuss the plan of expenditure. The purchase committee is formed to ensure

consistent and correct norms of procurement practices and is responsible for monitoring, verifying and ensuring that approved procurement procedures have been applied properly.

4. The head of departments ensure timely and routine maintenance and up-gradation of laboratories, library, computing facilities, classrooms, equipment, and other facilities. According to the requirements submitted by conveners of committees and teachers-in-charge, a budget is prepared and the financial activities proceed.

5. The students give fee for admission into various streams, thereafter collecting the funds for college. After admission, the Janbhagidari committee of the college decide to use Janbhagidari funds for institute developments.

6. The expenses for conducting the examination such as invigilator's remuneration, stationary expenses, expenses for conducting the practical examination are provided by the university and then allocated to various heads by the exam superintendent and the exam coordinator for smooth conduct of the exams.

#### **Internal Audit:**

The institution has established a mechanism for conducting internal audits on financial transactions every year to ensure financial compliance. The committee thoroughly verifies the income and expenditure details and the compliance report of the internal audit of the Government Head, Non-government head and Janbhagidari is submitted to the Principal of the institution through IQAC.

As per order of Principal, the Internal Audit committee, carried out the audit mainly focused on the finance department for every academic session following head:

**(1) Government Head**

**(2) Non-Government Head**

**(3) Janbhagidari Head.**

A meeting of the Internal Audit Committee was held in the Principal office where the income expenditure incurred by the college's government head, Non-Government head and Janbhagidari head was observed. All documents provided by the account branch are observed by an internal financial committee on a yearly basis. The expenses incurred under heads are provided by the account branch of the college.

#### **External Audit:**

External Audit is conducted through CA by the internal audit committee to audit financial income and expenditure annually incurred at the college under Janbhagidari's head. After this, external audit is conducted through CA. Financial audit is mandatory and accounts of the college are annually audited by Mr. M. Bharat, CA, Bilaspur, Chhattisgarh.

It reviews teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals and records the incremental improvement in various activities**

### Response:

Since its inception, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has been working for the development of the college in its teaching-learning mechanism and administrative measures for achieving its vision and mission. The IQAC is a nodal agency of the college for initiating and coordinating quality-related issues. Established on 28 November 2017. The IQAC contributes to almost every sphere of activities in the college. Continuous development being a prime objective of IQAC, it tries its best to cater to the needs of all stakeholders of the college.

### USE of ICT

The major efforts made by IQAC are improvement of ICT based facilities in the departments, for the faculties. Enriching & promoting quality assurance policies in the institute, development of mechanisms and outcomes with the stakeholders by maintaining modified teaching learning methodologies, updating college websites and through alumni meetings, teacher meetings etc.

- (1) The college has installed ICT-enabled e-classrooms to upgrade the teaching-learning experience.
- (2) IQAC motivates faculties to provide knowledge of online E-resources like zoom app, Google meet, WebEx, etc. for conducting online classes and organizing the webinar on the platform.
- (3) Faculty of the college also present PowerPoint presentations using a projector and smart board.
- (4) The department of the college organized seminars, invited talks and lectures using ICT tools.

The teaching-learning, co-curricular and extracurricular activities aimed at the round development of students are monitored by IQAC which incessantly endeavors for academic growth, research enhancement, employability, and skill development of the students. The IQAC has evolved diverse mechanisms and procedures for the following objectives:

- (1) At the beginning of the academic year, the academic calendar, timetable, teaching plan, PO/PSO/CO are prepared by committee and respective faculty for the current session under the supervision of IQAC.
- (2) The college has adopted a method of assessing the academic performance of the students on a continuous basis, such as unit test, written, oral, practical and integrated mode.

(3) IQAC focuses on all remedial, tutorial and group discussion classes of all subjects and all curricular and co-curricular activity regularly to bring the marginalized into mainstream academia.

(4) Slow and Advanced learner analysis is done by all subject teachers under the supervision of IQAC and mentors are appointed for students of all classes and teachers pay good attention to students.

(5) The feedback of different stakeholders, students, teachers and alumni are collected and feedback analysis committee analyses all feedback given by stakeholders and prepares action taken report and submit to Principal of college through IQAC.

(6) MoU between Indira Gandhi Govt. College Pandaria and other colleges agree to cooperate in collaboration that would be mutually beneficial.

(7) IQAC encourages students to participate in sports, cultural and extension activities that are organised at an extensive rate.

(8) Green audit, environmental audit, energy audit, academic audit are done under the banner of IQAC.

(9) IQAC organized an administrative training program for teaching and non-teaching staff of colleges whose aim is to improve the quality and skill of every teaching and non-teaching staff member.

4. Further the women's cell comprising staff members & student representatives also conduct special seminars and answer the complaints lodged by the students.
5. Indira Gandhi Govt. College Pandaria believes that, as stakeholder's parents are also partners in promoting security and safety.
6. CCTV cameras are installed in the college premises with 24 hours surveillance to observe the ongoing activities.
7. A complaint and a suggestion box is fixed at the main entrance gate for complaints & suggestions concerning any shortcomings and abuse or harassment faced by students.
8. The Grievance Redressal committee attends to complaints dealing with social issues, anti-ragging, and sexual harassment etc.
9. Health, Hemoglobin etc. check-ups are conducted from time to time and students are organized health check-up camp for faculty & also students.
10. The administrators take care of maintenance and supervision of the campus.
11. The college organizes seminars/special talks to inculcate moral values, gender equality and sensitivity, highlighting social problems and suggesting solutions.
12. Yoga, personality development, stress management and career guidance programs are conducted from time to time.
13. For various Commemorative days, National events and festivals of national importance are celebrated with full fervor and fanfare in the presence of the teaching & non-teaching staff and students along with cultural performances.

14. The college has a Social Responsibility cell that takes charge of organizing and celebrating various National and Religious festivals.

- Objectives:-

1. To grow/ begin plants, Monitor & Restoration plant in our block with the help of college alumini..
2. To raise the awareness among students & prepare health cards of plants.

Context:-

- The block Pandaria is situated in a developing area of the district-Kabirdham, & for Urbanization & Development needs ground space for these processes.

The Kawardha district is famous for sugar synthesis & jaggery/ drying the molasis formation. For the making of these products, they establish large factories. They gradually emit huge amounts of black gases & they bind with fog atoms & cover up at tree level at night.

- The sugar cane plant (*Saccharum officinarum*) absorbs more water in comparison than other agricultural plants because it is the main product of the sap of stems, so it rapidly decreases the ground water level of the soil horizon.
- According to “Ground water Book of Chhattisgarh 2020-2021” the average rain fall is normal in Pandaria block (1407.28 mm) but in recent years the water depth has also increased, gradually, falling the water level 20cms./ year.

The Practice-

- There is a plantation promoting programme done by the faculty & students with the help of alumni.
- Organized various types of relevant seminars regarding planning.
- Outside the campus, select a possible zone for the plantation has SDM colony of the Pandaria block. In that place, plants grow regularly and around the tree guard plants for safety purposes in the juvenile stages.
- For the proper growth of plants, use different kinds of strategies.
- For the restoration of these plants, there are various kinds of multiple techniques used as possible

- Evidence of Success:-

- With the help of some alumni, the tree planting event was done in SDM colony of Pandaria block.
- Around the plants, tree guards are placed for the protection of these plants to various kinds of hazards & provide some nutrients.
- During the monitoring & restoration process, students applied various kinds of medicine and according to symptoms.
- For the proper monitoring by the institute, a “Health Report Card” of proper maintenance of plants & by those help cards is very easy to evaluate & restore individual plants.

• Problems Encountered & Resources Required.

- Lack of safety & safety of juvenile plants for humans & grazing animals.
- Low awareness of general plant species for indigenous people.
- Restoration & monitoring is not easy due to different kinds of challenges e.g. - environmental factors, anthropogenic factors, pollution etc.
- For the management & Restoration of Qualified Persons for this work.
- Lack of proper funding for Environmental purposes & Safety Aspects.
- High use of Insecticides, Pesticides & nutrients is useful for plants but these things are harmful for other factors.

During the cleaning movement the students collect litters from classrooms, gardens & also dispose in suitable containers.
